


Sherlyn Hernandez writes, "...the journey that rise like the star which leads me to many opportunity that rise like the sun" in her Izibongo Poem

## **JumpRope Family Accounts**

JBS uses standards-based grading to assess students, set goals with students, and measure growth. Standards-based grading is an assessment philosophy that shifts student feedback from work the student has done to what the student knows. All JBS assessments are aligned to learning objectives and students receive feedback on how well they have achieved those objectives. On JumpRope, students can see their progress from 1 to 4.
