




# **Rigorous Course Work - Contemporary to Classics**




#### How to read a JumpRope report

JumpRope can provide students and families with information about what a student knows and can do. Each class has learning targets. These targets are what a student is attempting to learn. Teachers provide multiple assignments for each learning target. The assignment is how the students shows what they know and can do. Make sure you look at JumpRope every week with your student.


## JBS STEAM Nite - May 9
